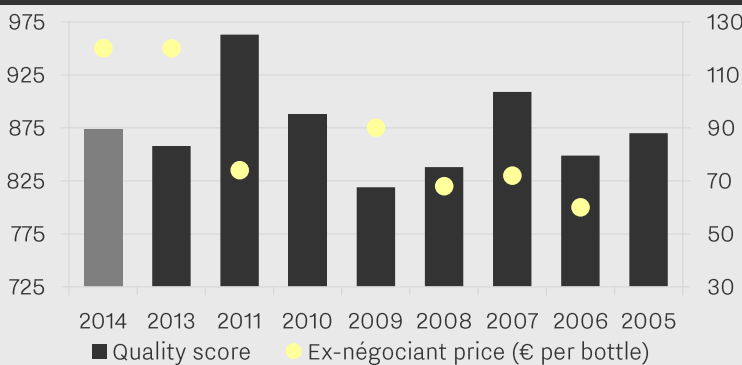

Fargues Quality score vs ex-négociant price



The 2013 and 2014 ex-négociant release prices represent a significant step change from earlier vintages, as the château attempts to reposition itself in a difficult climate for Sauternes. 2014's release price looks tenable compared to 2013, which has increased in value since release, with a slightly lower Quality score. Relatively, 2011 looks good value, released at €74 per bottle, and currently available at £80, with the château's second best Quality score ever.

Across all vintages, Fargues has a strong Economics score, due to on the one hand relatively good liquidity and low price volatility, but on the other hand slow growth rates.



106 bottles of the top 5 vintages traded over the past four quarters – making it the sixth most-traded Sauternes.
